



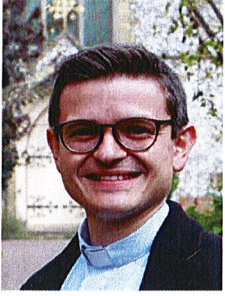

# Letter from the Manse



Dear friends,

Jesus has lots of different names or titles in the Bible: Immanuel, Prince of Peace, Son of David, the list goes on. The most common title Jesus is called is the Christ or the Messiah – the one promised to the Jewish people who was going to come and rescue his people. However, Jesus rarely called himself that; rather, he often called himself the ‘Son of Man’. I recently received an email asking if I might unpack this phrase so... here it goes!

The phrase ‘Son of Man’ is sometimes used in the Old Testament as a synonym for ‘man’. For example, when God speaks to the Prophet Ezekiel, he calls him ‘Son of Man’ emphasising Ezekiel’s humanity. However, in Daniel Chapter 7 the phrase ‘Son of Man’ seems to be used in a different way. Daniel is an Israelite prisoner of war having been taken from Israel to Babylon to work for the Babylonian empire under the Babylonian king. Whilst in Babylon, Daniel has a crazy dream which Daniel says himself ‘disturbed’ him (Daniel 7: 15). Amongst the talk of beasts, which represented historical earthly kingdoms (including Babylon) that were against God’s values, there is the imagery of a heavenly court. The court is gathered and God, described as the Ancient of Days, brings judgment against these evil kingdoms and in favour of his people. Daniel then records this:

*‘There before me was one like a son of man, coming with the clouds of heaven. He approached the Ancient of Days and was led into his presence. He was given authority, glory and sovereign power; all nations and peoples of every language worshiped him. His dominion is an everlasting dominion that will not pass away, and his kingdom is one that will never be destroyed’ (Daniel 7: 13-14).*

So, in Daniel’s vision, this human ascends and has equality with God, people worship him and he has an everlasting kingdom. Now if we cast our minds back to when God gives the Israelites the Ten Commandments, the first commandment is ‘you shall have no other gods before me’ and the second instructs the Israelites not to worship ‘an image in the form of anything in heaven above or on the earth beneath or in the waters below’ (Exodus 20). The fact that this ‘one like a son of man’ is worshiped in the presence of the Ancient of Days shows he is God: he is fully human and fully God.

Around the same time as the book of Daniel, the book of 1 Enoch was written. 1 Enoch is not part of the Bible; however, the book of Jude does quote 1 Enoch and some suggest that Jesus draws on this writing. Therefore, although it is not scripture, it was clearly a significant piece of writing that shaped some of the thinking of Jesus’ contemporaries. Whilst in Daniel 7 there is only a brief mention of the Son of Man, there is a whole chapter devoted to the title in 1 Enoch.

According to the 1 Enoch, the Son of Man was chosen by God to be the light of the nations, with God before the world is created, hidden by God until the right time and given authority by God. He is the one through whom God brings justice, a divine Judge and the one who exposes and defeats evil. So, when Jesus refers to himself as the Son of Man, he is claiming to be the one who will bring all of this about.

When Jesus was on trial and being condemned to death, he said, “From this moment on, you will see the Son of Man sitting at God’s right hand and coming on the clouds (Matthew 26:64). The way Jesus exposed and defeated evil is through the cross. Jesus viewed the cross as his throne where he let evil do its worst, and then he overcame it with his divine life and love.

The Son of Man is Jesus, God incarnate, who came to destroy evil through his death and resurrection and who invites us to partner with him in showing God’s divine life and love to the world.

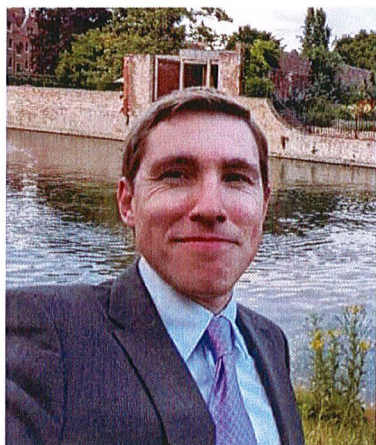

# MEMORIAL CANDLE DAY



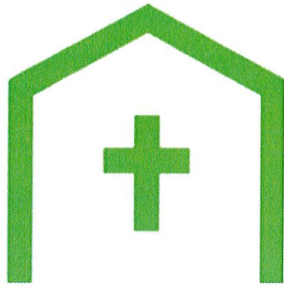

## CHRISTIANS AGAINST POVERTY MONEY MANAGEMENT COURSE

I have recently trained as a CAP Money Coach and will be running my first course on Saturdays 7<sup>th</sup>, 14<sup>th</sup>, 21<sup>st</sup>, and 28<sup>th</sup> February from 10am – 11.30am at Felpham Methodist Church. Please circulate these details to your church members and to anyone you know who might benefit.

The **Christians Against Poverty (CAP) Money Course**, now generally referred to as **CAP Money Coaching**, is a free service designed to teach essential budgeting skills and a simple, effective money management system. It helps people get control of their finances, save, and prevent debt, and is run in partnership with local churches across the UK.

- **Free and Accessible:** All CAP services are completely free, funded by donations. You do not need to be a Christian to participate; the courses are inclusive and open to people of all faiths and backgrounds.
- **Practical Skills:** The course (typically running over three or four sessions) uses a simple, cash-based system to help participants build and balance a household budget, structure finances, find ways to save, and use credit wisely.
- **Expert Guidance:** Sessions involve a mixture of videos featuring financial specialists, activities, and discussions, with support from trained CAP Money Coaches.
- **Ongoing Support:** Participants gain unlimited access to a mobile-friendly budget worksheet and online budgeting tools.

## World Day of Prayer 2026 Nigeria

Our sisters in Nigeria invite us to join them for the World Day of Prayer on Friday 6 March 2026. The service they have prepared reflects on the theme, "I will give you rest."

The World Day of Prayer is an international, women-led, ecumenical movement that shares the hopes, concerns, and prayers of women from around the globe. Each year, women from a different country craft a service, sharing their unique spiritual journey and culture. For 2026, the women of Nigeria have created a service that speaks to our need for peace and solace, drawing on their faith and experiences in a world filled with struggles and anxieties.

The preparation for this day is extensive. The writing country and theme are chosen years in advance, and the service then travels to the international committee in New York for translation and dissemination to national committees in over 120 participating countries. From there it is adapted and shared locally, culminating in gatherings at hundreds of churches every March.

This day is a powerful demonstration of global solidarity. It begins in Samoa and moves across the world in a continuous wave of prayer, finishing 38 hours later in American Samoa. It truly is a worldwide day of prayer!

## The Planets in February & March 2026

Mercury can be seen around 20<sup>th</sup> February setting an hour and a half after the Sun. Venus will be between Mercury and the horizon at this time, setting three quarters of an hour after the Sun. Note where the Sun sets, then note the position of Venus up to the left. A similar distance further on will be Mercury, then a similar distance on again will be Saturn. Mercury will be faint in the twilit sky. Binoculars will help but look only after the Sun has set.

On 1<sup>st</sup> March Mercury will pass close to Venus, Mercury is a little to the right of Venus and both will set approximately an hour after the Sun. Saturn will still be up and to the left of Venus. On 7<sup>th</sup> March Venus will pass Saturn, both setting an hour after the Sun.

Mars is not well placed for viewing, having recently been in conjunction with the Sun.

Jupiter can be seen throughout the evening and into the morning sky in the constellation of Gemini (the Twins). It sets around 5am in February and around 3am in March.

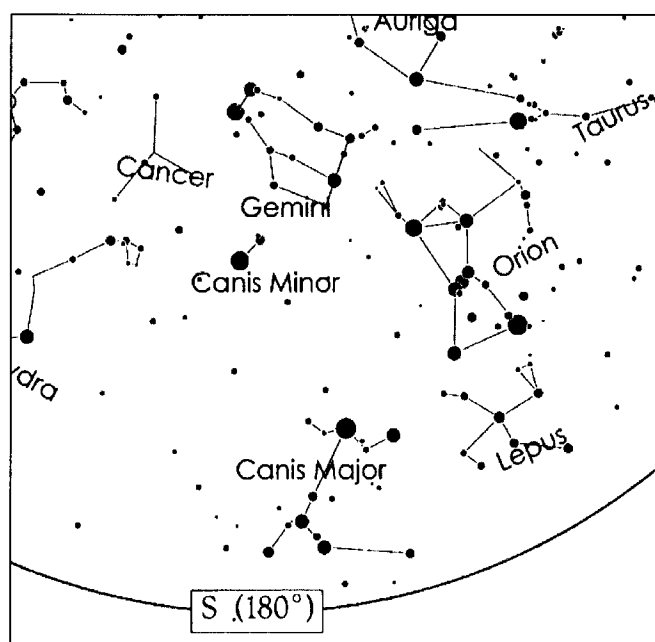
Saturn rises before sunset and can only be seen for a short time till it sets at around 8pm in February before sinking into the twilight in early March to be in conjunction with the Sun on 22<sup>nd</sup> March. It is in the constellation of Pisces (the fishes).

On 17<sup>th</sup> Feb there is an annular solar eclipse only visible from Antarctica. Watch out for this in the media and on the web as there may be some coverage.

The spring equinox is on 20<sup>th</sup> March. The constellations of the Pleiades (Seven Sisters), Taurus (the Bull) and Orion (the Hunter) are still on display. Following them are the constellations of Gemini (the Twins) and Leo (the Lion).

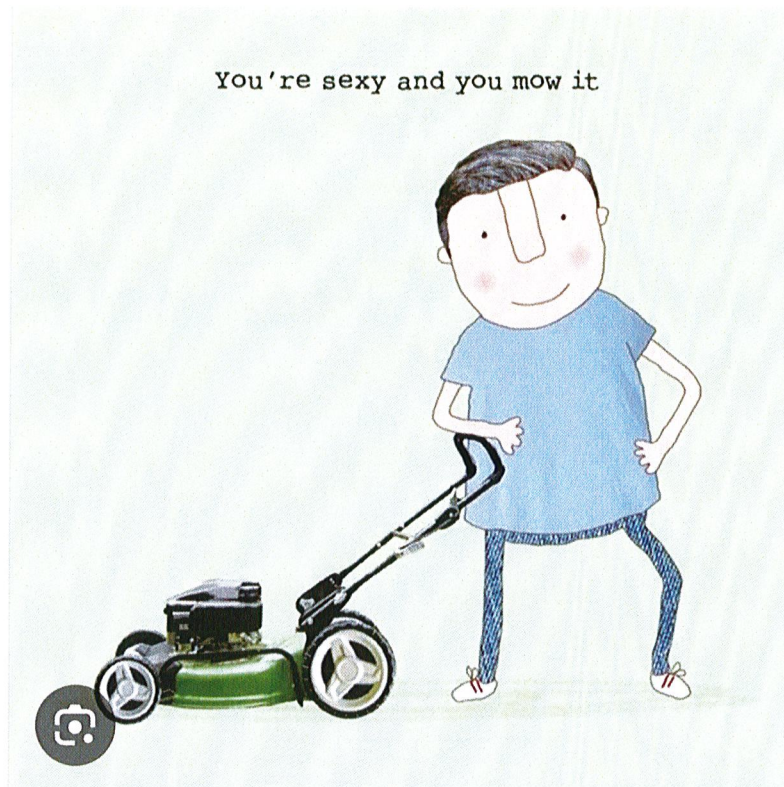
Full Moon is on the 1<sup>st</sup> Feb and 3<sup>rd</sup> Mar and new Moon is on the 17<sup>th</sup> Feb and 19<sup>th</sup> Mar.
